ORDER

On November 22, 2019, Plaintiff United States of America moved to terminate judgments in the above-captioned antitrust cases (the "*Paramount Decrees*") pursuant to Federal Rule of Civil Procedure 60(b). ECF No. 1. On December 19 and December 20, 2019, the Independent Cinema Alliance ("ICA") and the National Association of Theatre Owners ("NATO"), requested leave to file *amicus curiae* submissions addressing the Government's motion to terminate the *Paramount Decrees*. ECF Nos. 27 and 36.

"District courts have broad discretion to permit or deny an appearance as *amicus curiae* in a case." *Auto. Club of New York, Inc. v. Port Auth. of New York & New Jersey*, No. 11 Civ. 6746, 2011 WL 5865296, at *1 (S.D.N.Y. Nov. 22, 2011). Accordingly, it is hereby ORDERED that ICA and NATO's requests to file *amicus* briefs are GRANTED. By **January 17, 2020**, ICA and NATO shall file their *amicus* briefs, not to exceed 20 pages.

The Clerk of Court is directed to terminate the motions at ECF Nos. 27 and 36.
